<p>"Telemedicine means the practice of medicine by electronic communication or other means from a physician in a location to a patient in another location, with or without an intervening health care provider."</p> <p><i>Source: WY Statutes Sec. 33-26-102.</i></p> <p>"Occupational therapy telehealth means the provision of occupational therapy services across a distance, using telecommunications technology for the evaluation, intervention or consultation without requiring the occupational therapist and recipient to be physically located in the same place."</p> <p><i>Source: WY Statutes Sec. 33-40-102.</i></p> <p><b><u>Board of Chiropractic Examiners</u></b>            "Telehealth" means the delivery of healthcare services using electronic communications, information technology, or other means between a licensee in one location and a patient in another location with or without an intervening healthcare provider.</p> <p><i>Source: WY Admin Rules. The patient must be able to see and interact with the off-site practitioner during the exam. A medical professional is not required to be present with the client at the originating site unless medically indicated.</p> <p>See manual for eligible codes.</p> <p>Eligible providers:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Physicians;</li> </ul>

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	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Advanced practice nurses with a specialty of psychiatry/mental health;</li> <li>• Physician's assistant (billed under the supervising physician);</li> <li>• Psychologists and neuropsychologists;</li> <li>• Mental health professionals (LCSW, LPC, LMFT, LAT).</li> <li>• Speech therapist</li> </ul> <p>Provisionally licensed mental health professionals cannot bill Medicaid directly, but must provide services through a supervising provider.</p> <p>For end-stage renal disease-related services, there must be at least one in-person exam per month of the vascular access site.</p> <p>Quality assurance/improvement activities relative to telehealth delivered services need to be identified, documented and monitored.
